

## Online opportunities for revision

There is an abundance of online resources that pupils can use to aid their revision. This can be useful but also a distraction so these are the online resources that we recommend you access over the next few weeks.

### Access past papers, mark schemes and examiners reports on exam board websites.

To do this find out which specification you are taking and then find the website. Ask your teachers to show you if you are unsure and also request that they mark them for you.

### Create an online revision timetable

This website is great for general revision resources but the online revision timetable can be shared to your smartphone to help remind you of what you should be doing each evening.

### Moodle

The schools virtual learning environment is great for online revision. Since it was introduced in 2014 several departments share revision resources specifically aimed at our pupils.

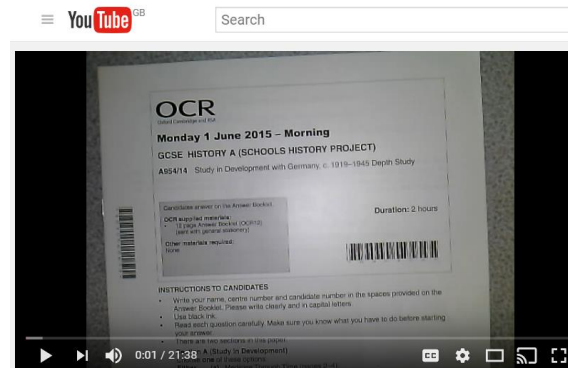
### Voice recorder on smartphones or Audacity

Write a script, record it and then listen over and over to key themes for your revision.



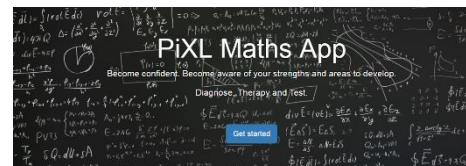
### YouTube
